The Boathouse is the most requested guest room at The Point, a newly renovated but much storied Adirondack resort.

INN SEASON Summer like a Rockefeller at **The Point**, an all-inclusive, year-round, 11-room Relais & Châteaux resort and former Great Camp of William Avery Rockefeller, nestled in the Adirondacks and situated on a secluded 75-acre property in Saranac Lake, N.Y. New owners purchased the property in 2016 and just completed a multimillion-dollar renovation. The changes pay homage to its rich rustic heritage while bringing The Point to a new level of luxury and soothing elegance. Visitors can take part in myriad on-property activities including lake swimming, waterskiing, wakeboarding, tubing, picnicking, walking, hiking, croquet, boating, fishing, tennis and badminton. Resort guests typically dine together and enjoy the cuisine of executive chef Loïc Leperlier, a veteran of a three-Michelin-star restaurant and five-star resorts in Europe and French Polynesia.
