The Point: Saranac Lake, New York

Situated on 75 secluded acres in the Adirondacks, The Point was originally built as a Gilded Age camp by William Avery Rockefeller. Today, the property is under new ownership, which has ushered in a refreshing renovation by Paige Hammond of Westport Interiors. Each of the 11 guest rooms has a wood-burning fireplace—ideal for curling up with a mulled wine after ice fishing on Upper Lake Saranac. And the Great Hall, with a roaring fireplace on each end, and spruced up with new drapery, lighting, and furniture, is where guests gather in black tie come Wednesday and Saturday evening to harken back to the high society of deep forest house parties. thepointsaranac.com
