At the Point, all-inclusive is taken to the next level, This luxurious hotel was originally <u>built by the Rockefellers</u> as their personal retreat and is set on 75 acres on the banks of Saranac Lake. The intimate hotel has just 11 rooms housed within four separate log buildings. Each accommodation is individually decorated, but they all have a rustic feel with sumptuous details like handcrafted beds, woodburning fireplaces, and soaking tubs while some boast additional amenities like heated floors and furnished outdoor decks.

During your stay, enjoy activities like cross-country skiing, ice skating, snowshoeing, curling, bonfires, and ice fishing, with no extra cost for any equipment rentals. But if you decide to venture out for some downhill skiing, Mt. Pisgah is about half an hour away. Every day you'll enjoy three gourmet meals utilizing seasonal ingredients and dinner is a particularly spectacular affair where the dress code calls for jackets and cocktail attire (and black-tie nights twice a week) with a seven-course meal that's paired with fine wines, served in a communal setting to spark conversation with fellow guests.
