Ed Kanze



With over 40 years of experience as a naturalist, Ed Kanze is The Point's local expert for guided hikes and nature walks. Formerly a National Park Ranger with generations of family roots in the Adirondack Mountains, Ed has provided premier guiding services for The Point for 20 years. He is a talented wildlife photographer and several of his photos grace the walls around the estate.

Pictured above is a photo of an Adirondack beaver taken by Ed Kanze along the banks of the Saranac River. Beavers, the second-largest rodent in the world, are the official mammal of New York State. They were almost eradicated in the 19th century due to over-trapping for their fur and the destruction of their habitat by excessive logging. Wildlife biologists have found that their dams truly aid wildlife as they provide a safe crossing of waters. Fun fact: Beavers can see underwater through their translucent eyelids.

Most recently, The Point is working alongside Ed Kanze to develop a third trail for guided nature walks. This trail will be available to guests upon our re-opening in June. Here one can learn about our abundant wildlife, native plants, and the geology and human history of the Adirondack Park.
