## POST RANCH INN Big Sur, California

Perched on the cliffs of Big Sur and designed by Mickey Muennig, this iconic coastal property epitomizes the organic architecture movement, blurring the lines between its guest rooms and nature. Baja California Sur's East Cape is the setting for this arresting property that echoes nature's raw beauty.
