HOTEL BARDO *Savannah, Georgia*
Awash in shades of peachy pink and earthy green, Hotel Bardo brings maximalist flair to a historic mansion. "Our 'riot clash' aesthetic mixes traditional styles with contemporary touches," says Huxley Hogeboom, an executive vice president at Left Lane Development. Colors of the World

An old-world mansion rendered anew, a jungle enclave enriched with whimsical decor, or a freestanding treehouse perched on the glittering Pacific coastline—**bold hotel design** has the power to unleash the imagination and cement a sense of place. Beyond the scenic landscapes they occupy, these luxury properties are travel experiences in themselves, with scene-setting details spanning from clever color palettes and artisanal textures to historic architecture and bespoke furniture. —*Nicole Kliest*



POST RANCH INN *Big Sur, California*

Perched on the cliffs of Big Sur and designed by Mickey Muennig, this iconic coastal property epitomizes the organic architecture movement, blurring the lines between its guest rooms and nature. "Our color palette is primarily material driven, as we don't highlight any separation from the inside or out and want to blend into the landscape," owner Mike Freed says. Accommodations range from treehouses sandwiched between the giant oaks and redwoods to oceanfront houses topped with "living roofs" made of grass and wildflowers. postranchinn.com



THE POINT RESORT *Saranac Lake, New York*

What was once a "great camp" owned by the Rockefeller family is now an immersive lakefront resort. Designer Paige Hammond enhanced the Adirondack look with individual room schemes, including custom headboards and twig coffee tables made by local artisan Larry Post. "The color narrative aligns with the warmth of the surrounding wood walls and floors," Hammond says. thepointresort.com

FOUR SEASONS COSTA PALMAS *Los Cabos, Mexico*

Baja California Sur's East Cape is the setting for this arresting property that echoes nature's raw beauty. "Soft sandy tones, warm earthy hues, and high contrast shadows evoke the feeling of the desert landscape and sea," Irongate design director Tyler Jorgenson says, adding that materials like weathered wood, handcrafted ceramics, and locally sourced stone anchor the hotel's sense of place. fourseasons.com/loscabos
